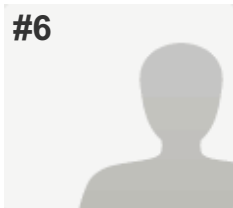

In LGBTIQ activism I got engaged, from 2008, as a social worker, peer educator and consultant in - NGO Safe Pulse of Youth that time member of IGLYO network in the form of full membership.

Now days as a delegate and nominee of DUGA / Rainbow Association I would like to continue my connection and engagement in IGLYO network.

My engagements within the Safe Pulse of Youth organization continued until 2012 in projects and activities such as:

  - 2010. Team coordinator of a research ("snow ball" method), implemented in Belgrade (Global Fund, Ministry of Health, National Health Institute)
  - 2010. Drafting National Strategy for HIV/AIDS (Ministry of Health)
  - 2011. Project coordinator in the program "Health-educational intervention for prevention of sexually transmitted diseases and HIV/AIDS (supported by Global Fund from Switzerland and Ministry of health (Republic of Serbia))
- Some more detailed activities and responsibilities within the projects were also:

- Writing essays on human rights and/or health topics/issues
