

Let's Talk About Our Schools LGBTQI Survey

This Privacy Statement explains what kind of personal data the IGLYO collects from you and how the organisation uses that data.

PERSONAL DATA

We do not collect any personal data that can be used to uniquely identify a particular individual natural person. The purpose of the processing of the survey data is to provide IGLYO with information concerning the opinions and experiences of young people under the age of 24, who self-identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, or intersex and who currently live in Europe. Through this survey we collect anonymous information for statistical and research purposes in order to assess the situation and contribute to the improvement of schools for LGBTQI learners.

WHAT WE ASK

The questions ask lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or intersex people about their experiences of school. In addition to these topics, the survey also includes questions about their sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, sex characteristics, age, and other demographical questions. Answering these, as well as other questions in the survey is voluntary.

WHAT DATA IS COLLECTED?

Respondents are invited to complete the survey online. We do **NOT** collect at any stage names, addresses, cookies or IP addresses, therefore your participation to the survey is completely anonymised and **nobody** can identify you at any stage or link you to the responses we collect.

WHO WILL PROCES THE DATA?

All survey data will be processed by IGLYO.

WHO CAN SEE THE DATA?

We do **NOT** collect any personal data that can identify you, such as names or addresses, at any stage. The anonymised data about your self-identification as L, G, B, T, Q, or I, your experiences and views can only be accessed by IGLYO to manage data collection activities, while the anonymised data set may be shared with third parties for research purposes.

WILL THE DATA BE SHARED?

The anonymous data may be shared with third parties for research purposes to ensure that the research community can benefit from the collected data when examining how people's experiences and opinions of school differ across countries.

HOW LONG WILL THE DATA BE KEPT?

IGLYO will start collecting data in June 2019. The anonymised dataset will be stored indefinitely for research and statistical purposes.
