

IGLYO — The International Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender, Queer & Intersex (LGBTQI) Youth and Student Organisation is a European network of over 95 lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and intersex youth and student organisations. One of our main goals is to ensure safe and inclusive educational environments for all LGBTQI young people by working with civil society organisations, governments, experts, teachers, parents, and learners.

To measure the effectiveness of inclusive education policies and practices, we are conducting the first European wide LGBTQI Inclusive Education Survey. As part of this work, IGLYO is commissioning a qualitative researcher to conduct interviews with LGBTQI learners to capture young people's experiences of school and help identify where progress is most needed.

Project objective

The main objective of this research is to document the experiences of LGBTQI learners in European schools and to raise awareness of these experiences among policymakers, educators, advocates, and the general public. This data should help national and local organisations in their advocacy work towards a safer and more inclusive education system for all.

Main tasks

For this project, IGLYO is looking for a researcher to conduct the interviews. The person will be responsible for:

- Conducting semi-structured online interviews (20 - 30 interviews)
- Transcribing the interviews

Qualifications, experience and other requirements

The successful candidate should have:

- Knowledge of qualitative research, critical social psychology, and narrative inquiry
- Demonstrated experience in conducting semi-structured interviews
- Excellent communication skills with fluency in English (good knowledge of other languages will be considered an asset)
- Capacity to work autonomously with the ability to multitask and meet deadlines
- Computer literacy and excellent IT skills for conducting interviews and transcribing them
- Demonstrated cultural sensitivity and knowledge of intersectional approaches to research
- Knowledge of the human rights of LGBTQI people in Europe (knowledge of inclusive education policies within Europe will be considered as an asset).

Due to funding requirements, only candidates who are eligible to work in the EU can be considered.

Timeline and conditions

The budget for this work is **€1.750**. The work can be completed remotely, but regular online meetings will be held with IGLYO's Education Officer to monitor the progress of the tasks. The project should be started by mid-August and all transcriptions should be available no later than mid-October 2019. The successful candidate can negotiate with IGLYO how the work will be conducted over this time.

Who can apply?

IGLYO will not consider age, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, sex characteristics, socioeconomic status, ethnic identity, religious or political beliefs, (dis)ability or any other non-work related criteria in the selection process.

IGLYO particularly welcomes applications from women, trans, and non-binary gender individuals.

IGLYO also welcomes applications from candidates who are under thirty years old.
